

#### Role of Council


- Sets big picture City policy

#### Role of City Administrator


- Recruits, hires, and supervises City staff

## Public Works

- Continued to grow the Utilities Department
- Operated the City's water and wastewater infrastructure and saw a significant decrease in afterhours call outs
- Oversaw construction of the Rob Shelton sidewalk improvements
- Began design of the Middle School Sidewalk improvements
- Accepted street, drainage, water, and wastewater improvements in multiple phases of multiple subdivisions
- Oversaw construction of improvements at City parks and facilities



Wastewater Permit Update

 TCEQ Granted the Permit on May 6, 2019

 An Austin opposition group appealed the granting of the Permit to the Travis County District Court

• Both the City and TCEQ appealed the District Court Decision

 The appeals court overturned the District Court decision, and the City is now waiting on a motion for rehearing

- Hired a Program Coordinator to expand Coyote Kids Nature Camp year-round during school breaks and holidays. Will also be implementing new youth, adult, and family programs at Dripping Springs Ranch Park.
- Memorial Day Rodeo, Bark in the Park, Festival of Flight, Family Scavenger Hunt and Hayride were successful community events.

- Rob Shelton sidewalk project from Sports & Recreation Park to Founders Memorial Park.







### **Once-in-a-Lifetime Event Coming to Dripping Springs...**



Annular Solar Eclipse October 14, 2023 Total Solar Eclipse April 8, 2024

The 2023 annular one will not affect us too much. However, Dripping Springs is directly in the path of totality for the April 2024 Great North American Total Solar Eclipse.

Not only will people be watching here but will be traveling to other locations through Dripping Springs. Fredericksburg is the heart of totality.

## Lighting Ordinance

## International Dark Sky Community

The City has had a Lighting Ordinance since 2000 and became Texas' first International Dark Sky Community in 2014, and the 6<sup>th</sup> in world

There are now 201 IDA Dark Sky Places in the world, 38 of them are dark sky communities, 6 are in Texas






## Applicability of the Lighting Ordinance

- City Limits; applies to ETJ through agreements, as a condition of an approval, and by voluntary compliance
- All signage in the City and the ETJ
- Commercial and residential properties





## The Lighting Ordinance Regulates Light Pollution

Wasted light that performs no function or task



Artificial light that goes where it is not supposed to go

#### LIGHT TO PROTECT THE NIGHT

Five Principles for Responsible Outdoor Lighting





**USEFUL** 



#### ALL LIGHT SHOULD HAVE A CLEAR PURPOSE

Before installing or replacing a light, determine if light is needed. Consider how the use of light will impact the area, including wildlife and the environment. Consider using reflective paints or self-luminous markers for signs, curbs, and steps to reduce the need for permanently installed outdoor lighting.

**TARGETED** 



#### LIGHT SHOULD BE DIRECTED ONLY TO WHERE NEEDED

Use shielding and careful aiming to target the direction of the light beam so that it points downward and does not spill beyond where it is needed.

LOW LIGHT LEVELS



#### LIGHT SHOULD BE NO BRIGHTER THAN NECESSARY

Use the lowest light level required. Be mindful of surface conditions as some surfaces may reflect more light into the night sky than intended.

**CONTROLLED** 



#### LIGHT SHOULD BE USED ONLY WHEN IT IS USEFUL

Use controls such as timers or motion detectors to ensure that light is available when it is needed, dimmed when possible, and turned off when not needed.

**COLOR** 



#### USE WARMER COLOR LIGHTS WHERE POSSIBLE

Limit the amount of shorter wavelength (blue-violet) light to the least amount needed.


